Wooden Fence vs Vinyl Fence

The board would like the homeowner's opinions on what type of fence they would like to see in our neighborhood. The current architectural policy mandates fences* must be:

"commercial-grade, wood construction and no more than six (6) fee high (unless otherwise approved). The finish must be either paint or stain, and a natural earth tone in color. All fence posts must be either integral to the fence structure or face the interior of the fence. Fencing cannot extend forward of the back line of the dwelling. <u>All fencing must be</u> <u>maintained in a high state of repair.</u> No chain-link fencing is allowed."

One homeowner, due to a language barrier, installed a white vinyl fence on Autumn Lake Place last fall. It was brought to their attention that it was against the architectural policies of our association in both material and color. The homeowner has asked the board to consider changing the fencing policy and feels that the vinyl fencing looks much better than some of the wooden fences that have not been maintained in our association. There are a number of wooden fences that are not kept up by being stained or are left leaning/falling apart. Please take some time to drive by the vinyl fence, and drive by other houses outside our neighborhood to consider the best direction our association should take to keep our property values up.
